

What Does the Diagnostic Do?

Our online diagnostic determines whether students are more likely to score higher on the SAT or the ACT. It also serves as a study guide for the test that the students will prepare for. Our nine page report identifies by topic all of the questions that students got wrong, so they can pinpoint the topics they need to master. Our report provides solutions for all of the wrong answers so students can learn from the diagnostic. Additionally, our report offers written pearls on how to ace both exams.

What's on The Diagnostic?

FOR MATH: Students are given 25 minutes to complete 20 SAT questions. They are given 25 minutes to complete 25 ACT math questions. (On the ACT students are required to complete more work in a shorter period of time.)

FOR WRITING: Students are given 25 minutes to complete 35 SAT questions. They are given 27 minutes to complete 45 ACT questions. (On the ACT students are required to complete more work in a shorter period of time.)

FOR CRITICAL READING: Students are given 25 minutes to answer 24 SAT questions. They are given 27 minutes to answer 30 ACT questions. (On the ACT students are required to complete more work in a shorter period of time.)

FOR SCIENCE: Students will be given 20 minutes to answer 21 questions. As there is not a science section on the SAT, students will only have to take one section.

When to Take the Diagnostic

Take The SAT/ACT Diagnostic as early as sophomore year. The diagnostic advises which test to study for and then notes the topics and skill sets that students need to address to improve their scores.

Too many students blindly take the test that their school points them toward. If a school offers the PSAT then its students generally take the SAT. Students who attend schools that offer the PLAN generally take the ACT. Our diagnostic helps students to determine which test they're likely to score higher on.

We encourage students to take The SAT-ACT Diagnostic prior to committing to studying for the SAT or the ACT. This saves time and frustration and is likely to result in higher scores.

So, when to take The SAT-ACT Diagnostic? Long before you get around to registering and prepping for the SAT or the ACT.

The SAT/ACT Diagnostic Saves Students Time

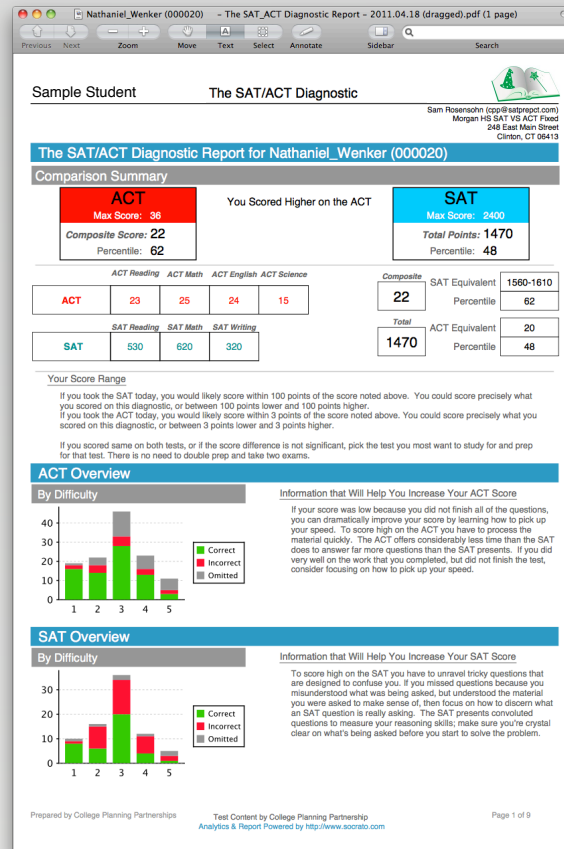
